# What have 3/4F been up to?



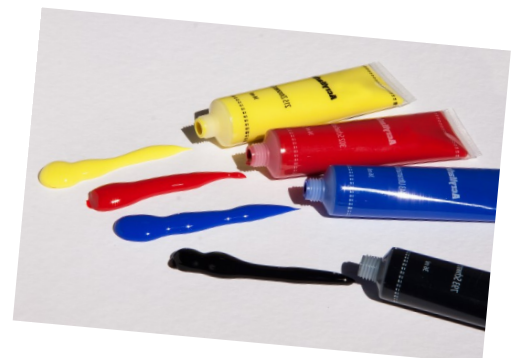
The artwork is called Winter Foxes with Moonlit Sky.
