Dental Check-Ups

Dental check-ups are unlikely to happen this year. It is recommended that we all have our teeth checked twice a year. When was your child's last dentist visit?

In Goulburn we have a number of options to make dental appointments for children.

- Use your private health insurance with a dentist, check with your fund as children are often covered for regular checks, preventative treatment and mouth guards.
- Child Dental Benefits Scheme—are you eligible? Check with Medicare. When making an appointment with a private or public dentist please let them know that you are eligible.
- 3. Goulburn Dental Clinic—all children are eligible 0 to 18 years. To make an appointment call 1800 450 046. Have your Medicare card with you.








Figure This! How long do you think you would have to wait in this line if you hold number 300?


