### **COVID UPDATE**

From Monday 7<sup>th</sup> March, masks will no longer be mandatory for all staff. However, those who wish to continue to wear masks will be supported to do so.

Over the coming weeks, our school will be considering activities such as assemblies, parent teacher meetings, and other gatherings. We will let you know if these can proceed within our school in a COVID smart way.

Families are reminded that we have now moved to symptomatic testing. Students were provided with 8 rapid antigen tests to be used at your discretion such as if your child is symptomatic or if there are cases in the class. Beyond that, students and staff can access PCR tests or buy their own rapid antigen tests as these are now readily available and accessible in the community.

- Helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- Gives students time to greet their friends before class
- Reduces classroom disruption
